Bison Report: Nate shared that they were going to have to suspend their operation for a year or two in order to save up enough money to allow them to buy their own herd. The demand for bison is so high that the cost of purchasing replacement animals has increased dramatically and makes their original strategy unworkable.

Chautauqua: John Koch reported that plans are underway for a Summer Chautauqua in late July or early August. He indicated that Rural Revival might want to consider a program as a part of that. He will follow-up at the April meeting.

Wholistic Management Workshop: Paul Ortman shared his enthusiasm for a workshop on this topic. He and Charity had attended such a workshop presented by Allan Savory and felt it was particularly valuable. There was initial dioscussion on the idea of doing something like this in the November – February timeframe. Perhaps with a presenter from the Leopold Center. Discussion to continue.
