<u>Community Visioning Event Evaluation:</u> There were 11 non-Rural Revival people in attendance. Thanks to Angie for documenting results.

Good discussion that always had to be cut off to move to next phase. Lots of deep, perceptive input with respectful talk. How to grow more farmers – farms with animals seemed to promote more interest. Few colleges have helped with agriculture programs. Perhaps it is lack of opportunity rather than lack of education that keeps young people away. Many do not want to farm and have an off-farm job. Question: are established farm families making room for the next generation? Could Rural Revival do more to educate people here and now about what life was like in this community at the prime time in the past for farming? Can new farmers be recruited by working with high schools and colleges? We should value and promote tech schools. These professions also contribute
